Overview of Movement Grants

- Previously EAA Fund
- 350+ applications, 108 grants, 30 countries
- Grants between \$4k and \$60k (typical size: \$20k)
- One round per year: current round closes March 12

Why Movement Grants?

- To find and promote the most effective ways to help animals
- To complement our Charity Evaluation program
- To support a broad and pluralistic movement
- To make the movement more resilient and successful

Review process

- Stage 1: application form
- Review 10-20 applications per day
- What we look for

What we look for



Problem prioritization

- Factory farming (especially chickens, fishes, and invertebrates)
- Institutional scope
- Neglected or underfunded: regions where the movement is still new or new approaches that have received little attention

Capacity-building projects

- For example:
- Projects that train activists
- Projects that bring more skills and resources to the movement

Overall organizational strategy

- Working on the most urgent issues strategically
- Movement Grants doesn't have a preference for operational vs.
 programmatic support
- Organizations should apply for the part of their work they believe is most in need of funding

Review process

- Stage one: application form
- Stage two: follow up questions
- Stage three: due diligence

Other grant programs

- ProVeg: apply by March 1 or June 1
- Effective Altruism Funds: apply by March 7 or June 13





Apply for Movement Grants Round 5

- Application is currently open
- Apply by March 12 (11:59 p.m. PT)
- Only one round of funding/call for applications a year!
